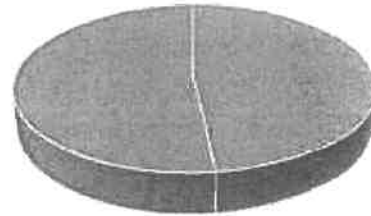

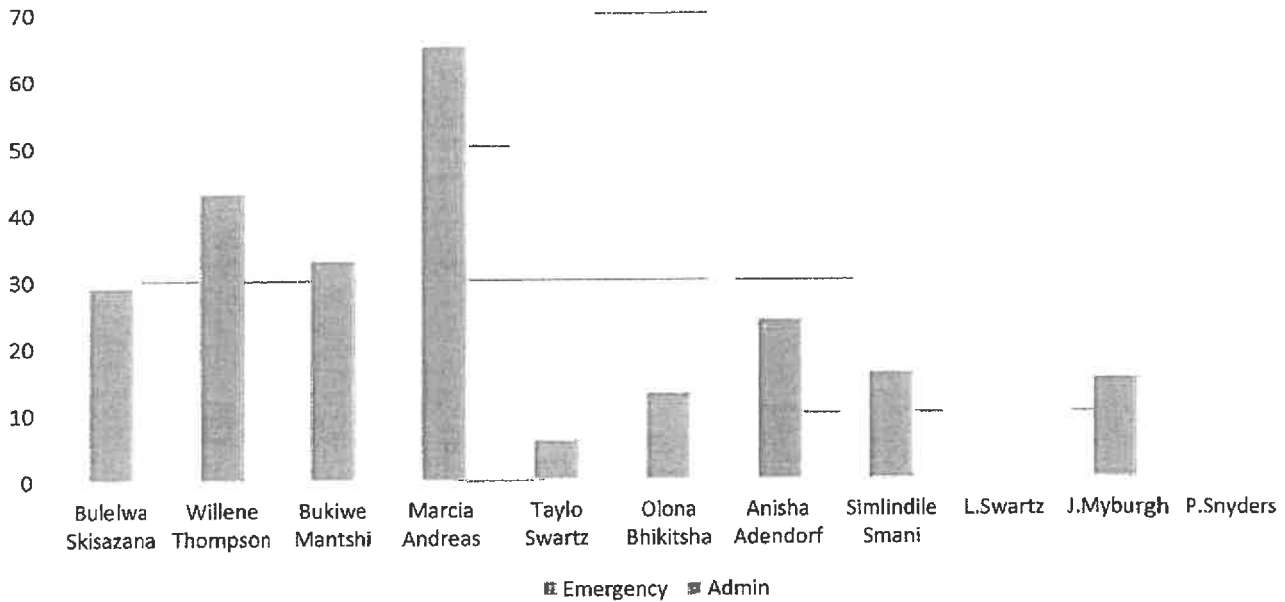
COMPARISON OF INCOMING VS OUTGOING CALLS

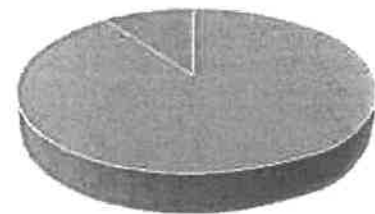
