In August 2019, VPUU NPC gathered data from each household living in backyard dwellings in Mountain View, Poppedorp and Proteadorp at that time. This data collection was part of the Informal Settlement Support Programme [ISSP], for future planning, prioritization and implementation of key interventions by the Western Cape Government Department of Human Settlements [WCG DHS].

As part of the ISSP, VPUU NPC is the appointed NGO for your town to provide:


- community participation

This brochure explains

the findings of the household survey in the three neighbourhoods. Since population statistics are always changing, the data is only a snapshot of what the neighbourhoods were like in August 2019. Verification is ongoing. The data will inform the future planning and upgrading of the settlement involving community partners, the Western Cape Government and Overstrand Municipality.

Who was surveyed?

- 420 people in 228 households in 226 structures were surveyed
- Overhills residents were also surveyed; those findings are shared in a separate brochure












