In June and July 2019, VPUU NPC gathered data from each household living in Overhills at that time. This data collection was part of the Informal Settlement Support Programme [ISSP], for future planning, prioritization and implementation of key interventions by the Western Cape Government Department of Human Settlements [WCG DHS].


As part of the ISSP, VPUU NPC is the appointed NGO for your town to provide:

Since population statistics are always changing, the data is only a snapshot of what Overhills was like in June and July 2019. Verification is ongoing. The data will inform the future planning and upgrading of the settlement, involving community partners, the Western Cape Government and Overstrand Municipality.

Who was surveyed?

- 1578 people in 749 households in 698 structures in Overhills
- 239 households in backyard structures were surveyed in Mountain View, Poppedorp and Proteadorp; those findings are shared in a separate brochure
















