DISABILITY CHALLENGE:

Three colleagues relate their experiences of being “disabled” for a day

Overstrand employee, **Angelo Ford**, is an ambassador for the Overstrand Association for People with Disabilities, an organisation that does great work for people who live with a disability. To create awareness of what people living with a disability have to cope with, he recently challenged a couple of our colleagues to ‘pretend’ to be disabled for a day and to report back on their experiences. Here is what they found:

BEING WHEELCHAIR-BOUND IS NO FUN AT ALL, RIANA STEENKAMP FOUND

Accepting a challenge to spend eight hours in a borrowed wheelchair initially kicked off rather well given that taking the lift to her office on the first floor went off smoothly and, parked behind her desk, the chair didn't seem to be all that cumbersome or uncomfortable. But two hours later, Riana was fast beginning to realise that this is not going to be such an easy ride after all.

Getting around the office to simply fetch paper for the printer or making a photocopy took much longer and resulted in many an upturned dustbin and several unsuspecting toes being run-over, and going to the wheelchair-friendly toilet turned out to be an impossible mission. “On top of that, my butt was getting sore, and by noon, all I wanted to do was to get up and stretch my legs,” Riana said.

However, she stayed put and bravely took to town during her lunch break accompanied by Nurse Heleen Mouton to see what that would be like. “Being so dependent on somebody else, is really not a nice experience,” Riana found, “and I now know why parking bays for the disabled are so much wider: Getting the chair in and out of the car turned out to be a real battle.”

Riana also found that the sidewalks in town are bumpy with many an obstacle that had to be negotiated, while some of the ramps that are supposed to make facilities wheelchair-accessible are way too steep to negotiate on one’s own.

“I also found it strange having to look up at people around you while talking to them. Normally, when you stand, you are on the same level as the other person. This made me feel that I was not in control of the situation,” Riana said.

“Nevertheless, it was a good challenge, and I now agree with Angelo: Simple things can become really difficult and complex tasks very quickly,” Riana concluded.

DIS ASOF 'N MENS WAT NIE KAN SIEN NIE, ONSIGBAAR WORD VIR ANDER, WAS ELMARIE HOONEBERG SE GEVOLGTREKKING

Elmarie se uitdaging was om vir 'n dag "blind" te wees. Binne die gebou kon sy met selfvertroue rondbeweeg omdat sy dit goed ken, al kon sy nie die kraan se knoppe in die badkamer kry nie, maar buite was dit 'n ander storie.

"Toe ek buite beweeg het, was ek verskriklik onseker," vertel Elmarie, "maar ek het ook opgemerk dat ek meer bewus is van geluide, soos 'n motor wat in aantog is of selfs iemand wat agter my loop, en my reksintuig was heelwat skerper: Skielik was ek bewus van die uitaatgas van motors en die reuk van my omgewing."

Elmarie het ook tot die besef gekom dat 'n blinde persoon op ander moet kan vertrou: "Toe ek 'n vergadering by regsdienste moes bywoon, het Elsabe my daarheen gestap en, glo my, ek het verdwaal gevoel." Tydens die vergadering het sy gevind dat sy baie minder gepraat en meer geluister het. "Ek het besef dit help om mense te sien en hulle lyftaal te kan dophou," sê Elmarie, en voeg skertsend by "en dat ek aan my luistertegniek kan werk".

Nog iets wat Elmarie opgemerk het, is dat mense Elsabe sou vra wat met haar skort eerder as om haar self te vra. "Ek het nogal gewonder of ek onsigbaar geword het omdat my oë nie kan sien nie. Voortaan sal ek meer bedag wees en seker maak ek gesels met die blinde persoon direk," beloof Elmarie.

"Dit was omtrent 'n ondervinding om 'blind' te wees vir 'n dag," erken Elmarie. "Mens besef nie watter voorreg dit is om te kan sien en hoe kosbaar daardie voorreg is nie: In die leefwêreld van die blinde gebeur dinge nie net sommer outomaties nie. Ek het groot waardering vir blindes se waagmoed en die manier waarop hulle in die donker sonder kleur leef."



GOING ABOUT DOING ORDINARY EVERDAY OFFICE TASKS WITH ONLY ONE ARM CAN BE REALLY CHALLENGING, SHANTAL MAREE FOUND

Shantal's disability challenge was to get through a "normal" workday with her right arm in a sling. "It was a humbling experience because an easy task, like filling my water bottle from a water machine, was very difficult. I had to use my knee to balance the bottle and had to wipe up the spilled water afterwards with one hand," Shantal said.

Typing took excruciatingly long, and having to balance a phone between one's shoulder and ear while typing on the computer can become very frustrating. Shantal also didn't like having to ask people to help her carry stuff around.

"I always felt very sad to see people with a disability, but now I see them as determined persons who strive to still be the best they can, disability and all," Shantal concluded.

MUNICIPALITY BANKS WITH A NEW PARTNER

As from 1 July 2019 the Municipality will be partnering with Nedbank for banking services and the new account numbers will be released in due course. Clients (including employees) paying via the debit order system need not make any changes as the necessary details will be updated by the municipality.

Those clients who pay accounts via EASYPAY, PAY@ or SAPO need only to present their latest municipal account at the pay point. (The new banking information will be pre-printed on the account.)

Clients/employees who are paying municipal accounts or traffic fines via the internet or want to renew their motor vehicle licence online, will have to update their beneficiary details in this regard.

COLLEAGUES CAPACITATED THROUGH BLUE FLAG BEACH WORKSHOP

Overstrand boasts three internationally-recognised Blue Flag Beaches in Kleinmond, Hawston and Grotto Beach. Castle Beach in Pearly Beach has also been granted a pilot status for the Blue Flag for the second year which, if it succeeds, may see Overstrand having four fully fledged Blue Flag beaches later this year.

To improve municipal understanding and benefits of the Blue Flag beach programme, the Community Services Directorate attended a capacity building workshop to get a better understanding of the Blue Flag Structure and Policy, Blue Flag Criteria and Application, Annual inspections: compliances and non-compliances, Blue Flag pilot programmes and Tourism Blue Flag projects.

"As ek samevattend my lewenslesse moet oopsom, is dit dat mens dankbaar moet wees vir die klein dingetjies en elke dag voluit moet leef. Staan sterk, ongeag wat die lewe ook al op jou pad mag bring, en, onthou, wees nederig - want sonder ander se ondersteuning, gaan jy nêrens kom nie."
