Stanford's Cove Parking Area

The photo indicates the proposed location where the photo frame is to be erected. Approval from the Building Department and Property Department is currently pending before the project can proceed.

Upgrades to the toilets and surrounding facility have been completed, thanks to the dedicated efforts of the Maintenance Team. Their work has significantly improved the condition and usability of the amenities for the children.



Sunshine Nation Pre-School is thriving and fully operational following the recent upgrades and generous donations received. The improvements have enhanced the learning environment, enabling the school to continue providing quality early childhood education and care to the community.





Kleinbaai Tidal Pool – Wheelchair-Friendly Walkway

Alderman De Coning explained to the Ward Committee Members the challenges being experienced with the proposed wheelchair-friendly walkway to the Kleinbaai Tidal Pool. In terms of environmental regulations, the walkway is not permitted to be constructed close to the rocky shoreline, which has created difficulties in identifying a suitable route that meets both accessibility and environmental requirements.



As a solution, it was proposed that the wheelchair-friendly walkway be developed from **Perlemoen Street** to the **Kleinbaai Tidal Pool**, ensuring improved accessibility while complying with environmental requirements. Construction of the walkway is scheduled to commence within the next two weeks and will be undertaken by the Operational Department.





For the 2026/27 Ward Specific Projects, the parking area has been identified as a priority project to accommodate wheelchair users. The designated parking area will provide convenient access for wheelchair patrons, enabling them to safely make use of the wheelchair-friendly walkway leading to the Kleinbaai Tidal Pool. This initiative aims to improve accessibility and enhance the recreational experience for persons with disabilities..
